



Two Special Summer Events classmates should try not to miss:

Martha’s Vineyard Mini organized by Herb and Laura Roskind, Sept. 23 - 26.

While the original notice went out some time ago, Herb and Laura have put the final touches on what will be their fourth wonderful mini on Martha’s Vineyard. They state; “September is glorious. It’s the best weather of the year.” The estimated price in addition to the hotel room you select should be only \$125 per person which will include:

Three dinners, and three lunches with a major part the expense for the special clam bake. In addition to the clambake, one evening we will have a BBQ with hamburgers, hotdogs and chicken and an evening with steak and lobster-tails with salads for all meals. Drinks will be wine, beer, soft drinks, and bottled water. There will be continuous food during the day for lunch. The idea is to be together, not separate in an overpriced summer restaurant. We will hire a grill-master for three days.

Price also includes the Vern Laux fee and his travel expense for the bird watching hike. (Everyone has enjoyed this in the past.)

It does not include Shenandoah sailing (\$70), Arrowhead horseback riding or Farm Neck Golf (\$110). These are optional and worthwhile, and we can arrange them for you. You can also rent bikes, motor-boats, and 1/2 day and full day fishing on the “Skipper”. Skipper is a group boat out of Oak Bluffs usually fishing in our area. Should note that Happy and I are taking our bikes over instead of a car, and there is wonderful easy biking around the Island.

For those of you who don't mind walking, please park on Douglas Ridge and walk up the driveway which is 100 feet further up Douglas Road on the left. Parking at the house is very limited so please consider car-pooling.
